Gentlemen-We wish to advise that in carrying out the development plan for the rehabilitation of the blighted area known as the University City Project No. 1, Michigan R-53, which is being undertaken by the City pursuant to Act 344 of the Public Acts of 1945, as amended, the Detroit Housing Commission (No. 11200), has requested the vacation of certain alleys within the limits of the project.

The Detroit Edison Company has reported that it has lines and poles in the alleys to be vacated and has submitted an estimate of \$5,148.00 as its cost of removing and rerouting

its installations.

Your Honorable Body may make provisions for the relocation of the lines and poles of the Detroit Edison Company in the streets located near the alleys to be vacated.

The Corporation Counsel contends that these relocating costs are not chargeable against the City. The case involving the liability of the City for
