Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—Several complaints of basement flooding have been received from residents in the area north of East Seven Mile Road between Chalmers and Crestline, extended.

Our investigation indicates the need to correct an adverse gradient in a lateral sewer serving these residents by providing a more favorable outlet. It will be necessary to extend the sewer about 113 feet across private property to achieve the correction which will relieve the flooding problem.

A right-of-way across this private parcel will be required and it is my recommendation that you authorize the Corporation Counsel to acquire this right-of-way by condemnation.

The land across which the easement will traverse is known and described as land in the S.E. ¼ of Sec. 1, T. 1 S., R. 12 E., (East of Gratiot Avenue), being the south 162.40 feet lying north of and adjoining East Seven Mile Road between Gratiot Park Subdivision and Gratiot American Park Subdivision, as recorded in Liber 5419, Page 426, Wayne County Records. The land is owned by the Congregation David Ben Nuchin, a Michigan Ecclesiastical (non-profit) Corporation. A temporary construction easement of 20 feet width will be required and a permanent easement of 12 feet width. This sewer easement is shown on City Engineer's Drawing DFC-7-314, "Proposed Sewer Right-of-Way," attached hereto.

If your Honorable Body concurs in my recommendation, the following resolution has been prepared for your consideration.

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—We are returning herewith the petitions of the General Motors Corporation, Nos. 8789 and 8790, requesting the vacation of Reissman Avenue between Rademacher and Crawford Avenues, the east-west public alleys north and south thereof, and the "L" shaped alley east of Crawford south of Fort Street. The vacation of said street and alleys was approved by the City Plan Commission and the petitions were then referred to this office by your Committee of the Whole for investigation and report.

We wish to advise that our investigations are completed.

As per our directive, the petitioner paid into the City Treasury, the sum of \$2,315.42, Receipt No. B-32587, credited to the Public Works Street Maintenance Fund Code No. 143-6241, said amount being the original cost of paving Rademacher and Crawford Streets at the intersection of the street and alleys to be vacated.

The petitioner also deposited with the City Treasurer the sum of \$895.00, Receipt No. B-32588, credited to the Public Lighting Commission Fund Code No. 990-9423, said amount being the estimated cost of relocating street lighting units and wires from the area to be vacated.

The petitioner also deposited with the City Treasurer, the sum of \$450.00, Receipt No. B-32589, credited to the Detroit Fire Department Fund Code No. 990-9406, said amount being the estimated cost of removing one fire hydrant from the area to be vacated.

The petitioner also deposited with the City Treasurer, the sum of \$1,500.00, Receipt No. C-32459, credited to the Department of Water Supply Fund Code No. 500-6229, said amount being the estimated cost for the relocation of a catch basin line, necessitated by the vacation of the street and alleys south of Fort Street between Rademacher and Crawford Avenues.

The petitioner also deposited with the City Treasurer, the sum of \$1,200.00, Receipt No. C-32460, credited to the Department of Water Supply Fund Code No. 600(0000)(6232)001, said amount being the estimated cost of abandoning an existing water main, located in Reissman Avenue, to be

vacated between Rademacher and Crawford Streets.

The petitioner requested that the paved street and alley returns, at the entrances to the street and alleys to be vacated, remain in their present status as the petitioner plans to utilize same and has agreed, by letter filed with the original petition, to pay all costs incidental to the removal of the returns at such time in the future as the removal becomes necessary.

All other City departments and privately-owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by the vacation of said street and alleys or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations therein.

We recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.

Turnbull's Subdivision of the Northerly 397.00 feet of Lots 58, 59 and 60 of Crawford's Fort Tract, P.C. 268, City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 24, Page 87 of Plats, Wayne County Records, lying south of and adjoining the southerly line of Lots 34 to 50, both inclusive, all of the above-mentioned subdivision; also

All of the east-west public alley, 20 feet wide, east of Crawford Street and south of Fort Street, which was dedicated for alley purposes on March 21, 1933, J.C.C. Page 416 and on February

6, 1945, J.C.C. Page 276, being in fact the south 20.00 feet of the north 27.00 feet of Lot 8 of Kurth's Subdivision of Lot 61 of Crawford Subdivision of the Fort Tract, P.C. 268, City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 10, Page 5 of Plats, Wayne County Records; also
