Be and the same are hereby vacated as a public street and alleys and are hereby converted into public ease-ments of the full width of the street and alleys, which easement shall be subject to the following covenants, and agreements, uses, reservations, and regulations which shall be observed by the owners of the lots abutting on said street and alleys and their grantees and assigns, and their heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns forever to-wit:

First, said owners hereby grant to and for the use of the public an easement or right-of way over said vacated public streets and alleys hereinabove described for the purpose of installing, maintaining, repairing, removing, or replacing any sewer, conduit, telephone, telegraph, electric light or other poles or things usually placed or installed in a public street and alleys in the City of Detroit, with the right to ingress and egress at any time to and over said easements for the purpose above set forth;

Second, said owners for their heirs and assigns further agree that no buildings or structures of any nature whatsoever (except necessary line fences) shall be built upon said ease-

Third, that if any time in the future the owners of any lots abutting on said vacated street and alleys shall request the removal and/or relocation of any existing poles or other utilities in said easements, such owners upon whose property the poles or other utilities are located shall pay all costs incident to such removal and/or relocation, unless such charges are waived by the utility owners. Gentlemen—Petition No. 11540 of R. J. Frank, et al., requests the con-version into an easement of the eastwest public alley in the block west of Foster Avenue between Varney Avenue and Benham Avenue. The requested conversion was approved by the City Plan Commission and then referred to this department for investigation and report. This has been completed and the petition returned herewith.

In reply to our inquiries, all City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they have no objections to the conversion of the alley into an easement provided that proper provisions are in-corporated into the vacating resolution protecting their installations located in the alley.
