Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen — We are returning herewith the petition of Dr. L. P. Rutherford, et al, No. 9016, requesting the conversion of a portion of the east-west public alley, 20 feet wide, south of E. Seven Mile, west of Morang Drive, into an easement for public utilities.

The conversion of said alley into an easement was approved by the City Plan Commission and the petition was then referred to this office by your Committee of the Whole for investigation and report.

We wish to advise that our investigations are completed.

The petitioner has requested that the paved alley return, at the entrance to the alley to be vacated, remain in its present status, as the petitioner plans to utilize same and has agreed by letter filed with the original petition to pay all costs incidental to the removal of the return at such time in the future as the removal becomes necessary.

All City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they have no objections to the conversion of the alley into an easement, provided that proper provisions are incorporated into the vacating resolution protecting their interests in the installations located in said alley.

We recommend the adoption of the attached resolution.

Resolved, That all that part of the east-west public alley, 20 feet wide, south of E. Seven Mile Road, west of Morang Drive, as platted in Obenaur, Barber and Laing's Dunord Park Subdivision No. 7 of part of the Third Concession of Private Claim 231, City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 59, Page 41 of Plats, Wayne County Records, lying north of and adjoining the northerly line of Lot 578, south of and adjoining the southerly line of Lots 575, 576, and 577, and south of and ad-

joining the southerly line of the easterly 3.20 feet of Lot 574, all of the above-mentioned subdivision.

Be and the same is vacated as public alley and is hereby converted into public easement of the full width of the alley, which easement shall be subject to the following covenants and agreements, uses, reservations, and regulations, which shall be observed by the owners of the lots abutting on said alleys and by their grantees and assigns, and their heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns forever, to-wit:

First, said owners hereby grant to and for the use of the public an easement or right-of-way over said vacated public alleys hereinabove described for the purpose of installing, maintaining, repairing, removing, or replacing any sewer, conduit, telephone, telegraph, electric light or other poles or things usually placed or installed in a public alley in the City of Detroit, with the right to ingress and egress at any time to and over said easements for the purposes above set forth;

Second, said owners for their heirs and assigns further agree that no buildings or structures of any nature whatsoever (except necessary line fences) shall be built upon said easements;

Third, that if at any time in the future the owners of any lots abutting on said vacated alleys shall request the removal and/or relocation of any existing poles or other utilities in said easements, such owners upon whose property the poles or other utilities are located shall pay all costs incident to such removal and/or relocation, unless such charges are waived by the utility owners.
