Gentlemen—Petition No. 12834, of the Huck Manufacturing Company, et al, requests the conversion of certain alleys in the block bounded by Bellevue Avenue, Frederick Avenue, Concord Avenue and Farnsworth Avenue into easements for public utilities. The conversion of said alleys into easements was approved by the City Plan Commission and then referred to this office for investigation and report. This has been completed and the petition returned herewith.

As per our directive, the petitioner paid into the City Treasury, the sum of \$258.00, Receipt No. C-27882, credited to the Department of Public Works' Street Maintenance Fund Code No. 143-6241, said amount being the original cost of paving the south one-half of Frederick Avenue at the intersection of the alley to be vacated.

The petitioner also deposited with the Permit Division of the Department of Public Works the sum of \$600.00, Receipt No. GR-13597, said amount being the estimated cost of the work involved in remaining the paved alley return, constructing new curb and walk, and backfilling where necessary at the intersection of the alley to be vacated south of Frederick Avenue east of Bellevue Avenue.
