Resolved, That all of the east-west public alley, 18 feet wide, in the block bounded by Seymour, Salter Avenue, Spring Garden Avenue and Kelly Road, the northerly 9.00 feet of said alley as platted in H. Welton Obenauer's Spring Garden Subdivision of part of the rear concession of P.C. 31, City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 67, Page 96 of Plats Wayne County Records lying south of and adjoining the southerly line of Lots 26 to 34, both inclusive, of the above mentioned subdivision; the southerly 9.00 feet of said alley as platted in John Kelly Estate Subdivision of part of rear concession of P.C. 31, City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 59, Page 1 of Plats Wayne County Records lying north of and adjoining the northerly line of Lots 196 to 201 both inclusive, of the last mentioned subdivision.

Be and the same is hereby vacated as a public alley and is hereby converted into a public easement of the full width of the alley, which easement shall be subject to the following covenants and agreements, uses, reservations, and regulations, which shall be observed by the owners of the lots abutting on said alley and by their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns forever to wit:

First, said owners hereby grant to and for the use of the public an easement or right-of-way over said vacated alley hereinabove described for the purposes of installing, maintaining, repairing, removing, or replacing any sewer conduit, water main, telephone, electric light or other poles or things usually placed or installed on a public alley in the City of Detroit, with the right to ingress and egress at any time to and over said easement for the purpose above set forth.

Second, said owners for their heirs and assigns further agree that no buildings or structures of any nature whatsoever (except necessary line fence) shall be built or placed upon said easement without prior approval by the Department of Public Works.

Third, that if at any time in the future the owners of any lots abutting on said vacated alley shall request the removal and/or relocation of any existing poles or other utilities in said easement, such owners, upon whose property the poles or other utilities are located shall pay all costs incident to such removal and/or relocation, unless such charges are waived by the utility owners.
