Gentlemen — The Assessment Roll was based on the above Assessment Portion. Under the provisions of the resolution authorizing the award of the Contract, any deductions from or additions to the Assessment Portion exceeding \$100.00 or one percent of the original Contract amount must be approved by the Common Council before the adjustment of such difference is applied to the City Intersection Portion.

Based on final field measurements, the following difference resulted between the estimated cost of the work in Assessment Portion of the accepted Proposal and that actually constructed:

decrease of \$237.00, or 1.9 percent of Assessment Portion of the construction cost.

It is recommended that the Assessment Portion of the construction costs remain unchanged from the original amount in the accepted Proposal and that the adjustment of the above difference be made in the City Intersection Portion.

Nativity Of Our Lord Church

Alley Vacation

Gentlemen—The above petition requests the vacation of the north-south and east-west public alleys south of Shoemaker Avenue first east of McClellan Avenue.

The petitioner has made the following deposits with the City Treasurer, which have been credited to the departments and accounts named, for the purposes indicated:

Public Lighting Commission Fund 990-9423, Lighting Division, Receipt No. B-30586, \$825.00, for estimated

cost to relocate street lighting wires from the alleys to be vacated.

Public Lighting Commission 990-9423, Communication Division, Receipt No. B-30587, \$590.00 for estimated cost to relocate fire alarm circuits for the alleys to be vacated.

Street Maintenance Division Fund 143-6241, Receipt No. B-30585, \$249.81, for the original cost of paving the south one-half of Shoemaker Avenue at the intersection of the alley to be vacated east of McClellan Avenue.

The petitioner has also requested that the paved return at the entrance to the alley to be vacated be removed by private contract with all costs being borne by the petitioner. The Department of Public Works has no objections to the petitioner's request provided the work is done under Department of Public Works Permit, specifications and inspection.

The Sewer Design Bureau of the Department of Water Supply has reported that they have no objection to the proposed vacation provided the petitioner relocates a sewer in accordance with Petition No. 2573 and resolution of the Common Council on November 9, 1966.

All other involved City Departments and privately-owned utility companies reported that they have no objection to the proposed vacation or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations therein.

The adoption of the attached resolution is recommended.
