Gentlemen-The above petition requests the vacation of the east-west public alley, to 10 and 20 feet wide, in the block bounded by Farnsworth, Frederick, Russell and Riopelle. A Warranty Deed has been received from the petitioner deeding to the City of Detroit land for the new alley outlet into Frederick Avenue. This deed was approved as to form and execution by the Corporation Counsel and as to description by the City Engineer, and is attached for your Honorable Body's acceptance.

Proper provisions are incorporated into the vacating resolution protect-City's interest in sewers located or to be located in the public right-of-way to be vacated. All other involved City departments and privately-owned utility companies reported that they have no objection to the proposed vacation or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations therein.
