Re: Petition No. 6064, H. F. Realty, et al. Vacation of Putnam Avenue and Alleys between Warren Avenue and Putnam, East of Lawton.

Gentlemen — The above petition requests the vacation of the public alleys, 18, 19 and 20 feet wide, east of Lawton, between Warren and Putnam Avenues; and Putnam Avenue between Lawton and the Railroad's right of way, east of Lawton.

The requested vacation was recommended by the City Plan Commission. The petition was then referred to us for investigation and report. Our report, accompanied by the original petition, is as follows:

The petitioner has made the following deposits with the City Treasurer, which have been credited to the departments and accounts named, for the purposes indicated:

Department of Water Supply Fund 600 (0000) (6232) 001.

Receipt No., \$800.

For estimated cost of abandoning the water main in Putnam and the remaining equity in said water main.

Public Lighting Commission Fund 990-9423.

Receipt No. A-18172, \$325.

For the estimated cost of removing wiring and street lighting facilities in Putnam Avenue, to be vacated.

Department of Public Works, Intersection Fund — 143-6241.

Receipt No. A-18173, \$777.

For the original cost of paving Lawton Avenue at the intersections of the alleys between Warren and Putnam Avenues and at the intersection of Putnam Avenue to be vacated.

The petitioner has also requested that the paved returns at the entrance to Putnam Avenue and the alleys to be vacated remain in their present status as the petitioner plans to utilize same, and had agreed by letter filed with the original petition to pay all costs incidental to the removal of same whenever the discontinuance of use makes such removal necessary.

All other involved City departments and privately-owned utility companies reported that they have no objection to the proposed vacation or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installation therein.

The adoption of the attached resolution is recommended.
