Gentlemen—The above petition requests the vacation of the east-west and north-south public alley, 20 feet wide in the block bounded by vacated Cullen, Stocker, vacated Patricia and Fort Street.

Resolved, That all that part of the north-south public alley, 20 feet wide, in the block bounded by vacated Cullen Avenue, Stocker Avenue, vacated Patricia Avenue, and Fort Street, as platted in the Edgar Place Subdivision on Private Claim 61 in T.2.S.; R.11.E., Ecorse (now Detroit), Wayne County, Michigan, south of River Rouge, as recorded in Liber 15, Page 85, Plats, lying westerly of and abutting the westerly line of Lots 31 to 33 inclusive of the above mentioned subdivision; also
