Re: Vacation of Streets and Alleys within the area of the Mt. Elliott-Lynch Road Grade Separation (Petition 701 of Dept. of Public Works).

Gentlemen—The construction of the Mt. Elliott-Lynch Road Grade Separation is now completed and open to traffic. In order to dispose of the surplus property, it will be necessary to vacate the streets and alleys which are no longer improved as the pavement has been removed.

Proper provisions are included in the vacating resolution creating easements for the Detroit Metro Water Department to maintain its facilities and for the Department of Public Works to maintain the grade separation structure.

All other utilities have removed their facilities.
