By Councilman Wierzbicki: Resolved, That all that part of the north-south public alley, 10 feet wide, in the block bounded by Sharon, Homedale, the Ford Freeway, and McGraw lying southerly of the south line of McGraw and northerly of the north line of the Ford Freeway Rightof-Way as platted in Sullivan's and Russell's Subdivision of the west 9.44 acres of Private Claim 40, north of Michigan Avenue, Springwells, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 14, Page 91, Plats, Wayne County Records; and as shown on Department of Public Works Drawing No. X-798, dated August 13, 1970,

Third, That if at any time in the future the owners of any lots abutting on said vacated alley shall request the removal and/or relocation of any existing poles or other utilities are located shall pay all costs incidental to such removal and/or relocation, unless such charges are waived by the utility owners,

Provided Further, That satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installation a result of any action on the part of

the petiitoner or assigns (by way of illustration but not limitation), such as storage of excessive weights of materials or construction not in accordance with Section 2, mentioned above, then in such event petitioner or assigns shall be liable for all costs incidental to the repair of such broken or damaged utility.
