The scope of this conference will have far reaching effects and should be the source of valuable data as to the direction of communications media in the immediate future. In addition to the presentation of new equipment components and operational concepts, material will be introduced covering such timely subjects as: "Mobile Digital Communications", "Automated Dispatch Systems Here, Now - Tomorrow", "Integration of Rapid Automated Integrated Dispatch Systems into Operational Communications" and "Computer Aided Vehicle Dispatch System". There will be workshop and panel discussions involving the FCC dealing with matters of location.

The attendance of our Commanding Officer from the Communications Center, Technical, would be most advantageous as all facets of this conference are of such magnitude that it is imperative that our department be involved. It has been requested that he attend the conference one day early (August 13th) to assist with the preparations. (He is a National Representative). The estimated expense will be \$361.00.

Honorable Common Council:

Gentlemen—We are in receipt of a request by Allied Delivery System of 2201 Fenkell, Detroit, Michigan 48238, to permit them to install a storm sewer from the parking lot of their expanded facility across a portion of the Livernois Sanitation Division Yard.

They are presently constructing an addition to their truck docking facility on the north side of Vernor to the west of our yard and wish to pave the yard surrounding the buildings. The Water Department sewers in Vernor do not have sufficient capacity to allow for the additional storm water from this paved area; therefore, they have recommended that the water be directed to the sewer in Livernois by a sewer across the Livernois DPW Yard which will connect with an existing drain, thence into the Livernois sewer.

Allied Delivery System has agreed to comply with the requirements set forth in the following resolution.

We, therefore, recommend the adoption of said resolution granting the Allied Delivery System a 10 feet wide permanent easement for said sewer and a temporary 40 feet wide construction easement.
