Gentlemen—I respectfully report to your Honorable Body that the Honorable Elvin L. Re: Advertising Exchange Agreement through Metro Transit Advertising.

Gentlemen — At its meeting held on Monday, October 30, 1972, the Board of Street Railway Commissioners approved adding one radio station to the advertising exchange agreements approved on January 24, 1972, and confirmed by your Honorable Body (JCC 193-194 February 1, 1972).

This agreement provides for the allocation of radio time to the D.S.R. in exchange for unsold (available) space on D.S.R. buses. This exchange of advertising facilities is in addition to transportation advertising space to be purchased by the station at the regular rate. The value of bus advertising to be sold and traded to this agency is as follows:

Medium: WDRQ-FM. Total \$ value

of trade time or space for the D.S.R. \$3,375.00. Total Cash portion of all contracts: \$3,375.00. Total value (cash & trade) of contracts: \$6,750.00.

Since the bus advertising space to be exchanged would otherwise be non-revenue producing, the actual cost to the D.S.R. for \$3,375.00 worth of radio advertising will amount to only sixteen (16%) percent thereof, or \$540.00, to cover Metro Transit Advertising's accounting and carding costs.

All such advertising to be used by the D.S.R. will be limited in content and form, so as to be exclusively a medium for advertising and promoting the business of the Department of Street Railways, emphasizing that travel by D.S.R. coaches is economical, safe and convenient.

The contractor has agreed to make these changes for an addition of \$14,572.00 to the contract price. This quotation has been reviewed and is reasonable. It was approved by the Board of Water Commissioners on November 6, 1972 as a charge to Account No. 550-9653-281 — Water Pollution Control System, Bond Proceeds.

Subject: Addition to Contract PC-246, Sludge Filtration and Incinerator Building Wastewater Plant.

Gentlemen — On February 9, 1971 (JCC 288), your Honorable Body approved the award of the subject contract to the low bidder, Barton-Malow Company, in the amount of \$12,788,000.00.

Subsequent to award of the contract, certain revisions in the work were found to be required. These revisions are: providing an exhaust fan in the ash silo gallery for proper ventilation; changing the battery chargers, control batteries and accessories to higher ratings required to provide sufficient power to the control and annunciator alarm panels in the event of power failure; increasing the size of the two louvered openings in the ash silo for proper ventilation; and changing 31 inswinging vents to fixed sash because these vents are partially obstructed and cannot be fully opened.

The contractor has submitted his costs to perform the required work in the total amount of \$10,157.26. This amount has been reviewed and found to be reasonable.

This additional work was approved by the Board of Water Commissioners, at its meeting of November 6, 1972 as a charge to Account No. 550-9652-966, Sewage Bond Fund.
