Returned herewith is Petition No. 1185 of the Board of Education requesting permission to design and construct a City sewer by private contract and to vacate the existing sewer easement in the block bounded by Dickerson, Lenox, Essex and Avondale.

The vacation of the sewer easement is necessary in order to allow the Petitioner to construct their building across the vacated alley.

Because of the vacation of the sewer easement, a new sewer is needed to service the existing properties that will remain intact.

All work is to be done privately

at the Petitioner's expense.

the sewer construction, including inspection, survey, and engineering, shall be borne by the Petitioner. Be It Further

Resolved, That upon satisfactory completion of the sewer construction, the sewer shall be City property and become part of the City sewer sys-tem. Be It Further
