Re: Petition No. 7608—Bouyer Funeral Home, Request to maintain steps and sign encroaching into East Grand Boulevard.

Your Committee of the Whole referred the above petition to this office for investigation and report. The City Engineering Department has made a field investigation of the petitioner's request. Our findings are as follows:

The steps at the entrance of Petitioner's building are encroaching 1.5 feet and his sign is encroaching 1 foot into the right of way of East Grand Boulevard easterly of Beaubien. The sign does not have a twelve foot underclearance.

All City Departments and private utilities have replied that they have no objection to the encroachments or that they reached a satisfactory agreement with the petitioner.

RESOLVED, That the Environmental Protection and Maintenance Department and the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering are hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to the Bouyer Funeral Home to maintain steps at the entrance to their building encroaching

1.5 feet and the sign in front of the building encroaching 1.0 feet, with less than a 12 foot underclearance, into the right of way of East Grand Boulevard, commonly known as 2920 East Grand Boulevard.

PROVIDED, That the necessary permits be obtained from the Environmental Protection and Maintenance Department and the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering and that same shall be maintained under their rules and regulations; and

PROVIDED, That no rights in the public streets, alleys or other public places shall be considered waived by this resolution; which resolution is adopted expressly on condition that said encroachment shall be removed at the expense of the permittee at any time when so directed by resolution of the City Council and that the public property affected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to said Environmental Protection and Maintenance Department and the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering by said permittee at its sole cost and expense; and

PROVIDED, That this resolution is revocable at the will, whim or caprice of the City Council and permittee hereby expressly waives any right to claim damages or compensation for removal of encroachment and further, that permittee acquire no implied or other privileges hereunder not expressly stated herein; and

PROVIDED, That the securing of the necessary permit referred to herein shall be construed as acceptance of the terms of this resolution by the permittee; and

PROVIDED, That this permit shall not be assigned or transferred without the written approval of the City Council.

Re: Supplemental Appropriation for Snow and Ice Removal.

The unusually heavy snowfall on December 1, 1974 of approximately 19 inches requiring over 14,000 tons of salt and costing approximately \$1,050,000 (to date), has caused the depletion of the funds appropriated for Snow and Ice Removal. As of Sunday (midnight) December 15, 1974, the cost of this activity was \$1,280,000; whereas, only \$1,282,400 was appropriated for the entire 1974-75 season.

It is estimated that an additional \$1,000,000 will be needed to complete the current season.

Thus, it is requested that your Honorable Body authorize and direct the Finance Director to transfer an additional \$1,000,000 to the Snow and Ice Removal appropriation as per attached resolution.

Re: Supplemental Grant — Food and Friendship Program.

On two previous occasions your Honorable Body has accepted grants from the State of Michigan Office of Services to the Aging for the operation of a feeding program for the elderly. Under this program, nutritional hot meals are provided to individuals whose annual income is near or below the current poverty threshold as defined by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget.

Once again the Health Department has been offered a grant of \$103,000 to provide 200 additional meals per day for the period October 1, 1974 through June 30, 1975. The grant is intended to be used for meal preparation and delivery.
