Re: Amendments to Project Agreements with the Michigan Department of Natural Resources for State Recreation Bond Fund Projects: B-63-D, Pelham Junior High School Swimming Pool, Amendment No. 4; B-959-D, Kettering Senior High School Swimming Pool, Amendment No. 1.

As a result of the final audit conducted by the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, the City is now in receipt of Amendments to Project Agreements required for the subject projects which revise the State Recreation Bond Fund portion as follows:

B-63-D, Pelham Junior High School Swimming Pool—\$938.00 in State Recreation Bond Fund monies is hereby transferred from this project to B-959-D, Kettering Senior High School Swimming Pool. Recreation Bond Fund portion \$196,714.00 decreased by \$938.00 to \$195,776.00.

B-959-D, Kettering Senior High School Swimming Pool—\$938.00 in State Recreation Bond Fund monies is hereby transferred to this project from B-63-D, Pelham Junior High School Swimming Pool. Recreation Bond Fund portion \$300,000.00 increased by \$938.00 to \$300,938.00.

It is respectfully requested that your Honorable Body accept these grants as amended, and authorize the execution of the subject amendments to project agreements.

It is further requested that your Honorable Body approve reallocation of City Funds within already approved total project amounts to cover disallowed costs as determined by State audit; this reallocation will not necessitate any increase of City Funds in the State Recreation Bond Fund Program.
