Vacation of Easement in vacated Canfield Avenue between Third Avenue and the Lodge Freeway.

On October 5, 1977 (J.C.C. Pages 2136-40) your Honorable Body vacated a portion of Canfield into an easement for public utilities, between Third Avenue and the Lodge Freeway (Petition Nos. 694, 2986 and 8480), as a part of the street closings made necessary by the development plans in the Calumet Rehabilitation Project.

As the development plans have progressed it is now necessary that two portions of the utility easement be vacated in order to accommodate the building placement for the entire project.

All City departments and privately owned utility companies reported that they will be unaffected by the vacation or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installation therein.

Lodge Service Drive said intersection also being the said N.W. Lot corner of Lot 23; thence from said point of beginning N. 22deg 33min 00sec W. 35.00 feet to the north R/W line of said vacated Canfield Avenue; thence along said north R/W line N. 73deg 54min 00sec E. 50.01 feet to the west line of vacated 16.9 foot wide alley vacated October 5, 1977, being the first alley west of Third Avenue, 70 feet wide; thence S. 22deg 14min 48sec E. 44.38 feet along said west line of a 16.9 foot wide vacated alley; thence S. 67deg 27min 00sec E. 49.46 feet along the north line of 15 foot wide public walkway said line being 15 feet north of and parallel to the south R/W line of said vacated Canfield Avenue, to the point of beginning,

Re: Approval for amending 1977-78 Official Compensation Schedule to include new classification and rate.

It is requested that the 1977-78 official compensation schedule be amended to include the new title of Fire Department Research and Development Coordinator (31-10-44) and the rate of \$28,424.00, subject to possible increase thru 77/78 salary negotiations.

The new classification was created as a result of a job survey conducted by the Personnel Department and approved by them on August 22, 1977.

The change of classification properly recognizes the scope and nature of the duties and responsibilities performed by James G. Merlo, Fire Department Research and Development Assistant — Captain. Captain Merlo supervises the activities of the Research and Development Section, is responsible for conducting and coordinating administrative investigations to identify, isolate, and analyze organizational, operational, procedural, and fiscal problems including peripheral trends affecting departmental operations; implementing and monitoring a management information system to insure that results obtained are both relevant and complete; compiling and disseminating information for administrative review; and alerting responsible operating officials of unusual findings. As assigned, his duties include investigating and reporting on special problems related to concerns involving inventory control, budget appropriations, labor relations and other matters; maintaining records and preparing special reports; and serving as departmental liaison between other city departments and various agencies.

Position change will occur in our Cost Center 26-0030-2111.
