Starting at a point in the southeast corner of lot # 148 (Euclid and St. Aubin) proceed approximately 1255 L/F north paralleling St. Aubin to lot # 109. Then west approximately 145 L/F to a point midway and on the east end of lot # 45. From that point proceed approximately 380 L/F northwest at an angle of approximately 28.5° to a point 50 L/F west of lot #55 and 700 L/F south of Holbrook Avenue, then directly north approximately 125 L/F to a point approximately 580 L/F south of Holbrook avenue at this point proceed 200 L/F west.
