Honorable City Council:

On January 18, 1978 this department was asked by the downtown J. L. Hudson store to temporarily remove a one vehicle taxi cab stand located on the west side of Farmer between 233 ft. and 262 ft. south of E. Grand River to provide additional area for their valet parking service. The parking restrictions on the balance of this block were recently reviewed by both the J. L. Hudson Company and this department on Friday, April 14, 1978. It was mutually agreed that we would establish a two vehicle taxi cab stand on the west side of Farmer between E. Grand River and 55 ft. south thereof for the convenience of the J. L. Hudson customers. The Public Vehicle Bureau does not object to this location and, accordingly, we have written work orders to post the necessary signs. We are, however, holding these work orders pending approval from your Honorable Body.

Re: Petition No. 327 of the International Union of United Autoworkers to Relocate the City Lateral Sewer in the E-W Public Alley First North of Jefferson and East of Fischer and to Vacate the Sewer Easement in the E-W Vacated Alley First North of Jefferson and West of Crane.

Returned herewith is Petition No. 327 of the International Union of United Autoworkers requesting permission to relocate a City lateral sewer by private contract in the west half of the east-west public alley first north of Jefferson between Crane and

Fischer and to vacate the sewer easement retained in the vacation of a portion of the east half of the same east-west alley.

The relocation of the lateral sewer in the west half of the alley is necessary to remove all flow from the sewer located in the east half of the alley so that it can be vacated.

There are no water mains located in the easement requested to be vacated.

The vacation of the sewer and water easement is necessary in order that a building can be constructed over it.

The Petitioner now owns all of the property abutting the easement requested to be vacated and, upon completion of the requested sewer relocation, there will be no other users of the existing sewer located therein.

Therefore, it is recommended that the petition be granted in accordance with the attached resolution.

Resolved, That the sewer and water easement retained by the City Council resolution of April 18, 1911, J.C.C. Pages 638 and 639 in the vacation of the easterly portion of the 15 foot wide east-west public alley, first north of Jefferson Avenue between Fischer Avenue and Crane Avenue and lying between Lots 105 to 108, inclusive and 121 to 124 inclusive, of Olde's Subdivision of Lots 24, and 25, P.C. 723, Hamtramck, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 12, Page 40 of Plats, Wayne County Records.

Be and the same is hereby vacated and cancelled as a sewer easement with the sewer therein reverting to the petitioner and no longer being City responsibility. Be It Further

Resolved, That the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department be and is hereby authorized to review the drawings for the lateral sewer relocation, and to issue a permit to the Petitioner (No. 327) to cover the construction, by private contract, of the relocation of the existing lateral sewer in the westerly half of the public alley first north of Jefferson Avenue between Fischer Avenue and Crane Avenue. Be It further

Resolved, That the sewer relocation shall be satisfactorily completed prior to any building construction over the herein vacated sewer and sewer easement. Be It Further

Resolved, That the entire cost of the sewer construction including inspection, survey and engineering, shall be borne by the Petitioner. Be It Further

Resolved, That the Petitioner shall deposit with the Detroit Water and

Sewerage Department, in advance of engineering, inspection and survey, such amounts as that Department deems necessary to cover the cost of these services. Be It Further

Resolved, That the Petitioner furnish the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department a synthetic (MYLAR) reproduction of the sewer drawings which were prepared for them by a registered professional engineer. Be It Further

Resolved, That upon satisfactory completion of the sewer construction the relocated sewer shall be City property and become part of the City sewer system.
