Re: Petition No. 5328 — Brooks Lumber Company. Conversion to Easement of the north-south and a portion of the east-west alleys in the block bounded by Trumbell, Eighth, Plum, and Kaline Drive.

The above petition requests the conversion of the above described alleys, 18 feet wide into easements for public utilities. The requested conversion into easement for public utilities

was approved by the Community and Economic Development Department. The petition was then referred to us for investigation and report. Our report, accompanied by the original petition, is as follows:

The petitioner has made the following deposit with the City Treasurer, which has been credited to the department and account named, for the purpose indicated:

EPMD — Intersection Fund \$169.00

For the original cost of paving Kaline Drive and Plum Street at the intersection of the alleys to be vacated.

The petitioner has also requested that the paved returns at the entrance to the alleys to be vacated remain in their present status as the petitioner plans to utilize same, and had agreed to pay all costs incidental to the removal of same whenever the discontinuance of use makes such removal necessary.

All other involved City departments and privately-owned utility companies reported that they have no objections to the conversions of public right-of-ways into easements provided that proper provisions are incorporated into the vacating resolution protecting their installations located therein.

The adoption of the attached resolution is recommended.

RESOLVED, That all that part of the north-south public alley, 18 feet wide, in the block bounded by Trumbull, Eighth, Plum, and Kaline Drive, abutting the rear line of lots 1 to 5 inclusive of the Plat of Julianna T. Abbott's Subdivision of Outlot 89 and that part of the Woodbridge Grove between Cherry and Pine Streets, Woodbridge Farm, Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 5, Page 36, Plats, Wayne County records; also

All that part of the east-west public alley, 18 feet wide, in the block bounded by Trumbull, Eighth, Plum, and Kaline Drive, abutting the rear line of lots 6 and 11, both inclusive of the above mentioned subdivision;

Be and the same are hereby vacated as public alleys and are hereby converted into a public easement of the full width of the alleys, which easement shall be subject to the following covenants and agreements, uses, reservations and regulations, which shall be observed by the owners of the lots abutting on said alleys and by their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, forever to wit:

FIRST, said owners hereby grant to

and for the use of the public an easement or right-of-way over said vacated public alleys hereinabove described for the purposes of maintaining, installing, repairing, removing, or replacing public utilities such as water mains, sewers, gas lines or mains, telephone, electric light conduits or poles or things usually placed or installed in a public alley in the City of Detroit, with the right to ingress and egress at any time to and over said easement for the purpose above set forth,

SECOND, said owners for their heirs and assigns further agree that no buildings or structures of any nature whatsoever including but not limited to concrete slabs or driveways, retaining or partition walls (except necessary line fence) shall be built or placed upon said easement, nor any change of surface grade made, without prior approval by the Environmental Protection and Maintenance Department.

THIRD, that if at any time in the future the owners of any lots abutting on said vacated alleys shall request the removal and/or relocation of any existing poles or other utilities in said easement, such owners, upon whose property the poles or other utilities are located shall pay all costs incidental to such removal and/or relocation, unless such charges are waived by the utility owners,

PROVIDED FURTHER, that if any utility located or to be located in said property shall break or be damaged as a result of any action on the part of the petitioner or assigns (by way of illustration but not limitation), such as storage of excessive weights of materials or construction not in accordance with Section 2, mentioned above, then in such event the petitioner or assigns shall be liable for all costs incidental to the repair of such broken or damaged utility; and further

RESOLVED, that the City Clerk is hereby directed to send a copy of this resolution to the Detroit Edison Company, the Michigan Bell Telephone Company, and the Michigan Consolidated Gas Company.

RESOLVED, That the surface grade and drainage in the vacated portion of the east-west alley, above described, remain the same in order to drain surface water from the portion of alley to remain open; if at any time in the future the grade is to be changed then a catch basin will be installed in the open portion of alley with all costs of installation borne by the petitioner.
