Re: Pilot Program—Snow & Ice Removal from Residential Streets.

The Environmental Protection and Maintenance Department will begin a pilot program to remove snow and ice from residential streets in the Northern District, or as much of the district as is posted by DOT. The Northern District is bounded by Eight Mile on the north, Ford Freeway on the south, Van Dyke on the east and Woodward on the west. The estimated cost of the Pilot Program is difficult to determine, since this will be our first attempt at clearing local streets on a regular basis. Furthermore, the amount of next winter's snowfall cannot be predetermined. The program cost is eligible for Street Fund reimbursement, however, funds are not currently budgeted.

In order to facilitate this program, the streets within the Northern District must be made one way. The estimated cost of signing and marking this area is \$455,000. The source of these funds is \$300,000 from New Street Construction (22-1290) specifically the Conner-Clairpointe project, which has been delayed, and \$155,000 from Traffic Signals-Urban Systems Projects (22-1220) which have not been designed. The above projects are only being postponed and not canceled.

Section 13(d) (1) of Act 51, P.A. 1951, as amended allows a city to use on the local street system up to 25% per annum of funds returned to the city for its major street system; and Section 13 (d) (2) further allows a city to transfer major street funds for use on the local street system to the extent that revenues, other than motor vehicle highway funds, were used on the major street system.

We respectfully request approval of the attached resolution which authorizes the Finance Director to transfer the necessary funds.
