 Re: Petition #11938 (1965), Chrysler Corporation, Vacation and Conversion to Easement of Molena Avenue east of Gilbo and alleys adjacent and dedication of new alley outlet.

The above petition, which was processed by the various City Departments in the early part of 1966, was not forwarded to your Honorable Body at that time because of an unresolved relocation of a Michigan Bell Telephone line; which work was to be performed at the expense of the petitioner, Chrysler Corporation. In late 1968 a check was made as to whether the relocation work had been done; at which time, the work not having been performed, the file regarding this matter was laid aside.

It came to our attention a short time ago that the utility relocation work had been completed, as had all the documents including the deed to portions of alleys to be dedicated. This deed was approved as to form and execution by the Law Department and as to description by the City Engineer's and is attached for your Honorable Body's acceptance.

Now that Michigan Bell Telephone has relocated, all City Departments and privately owned utility companies have no objection to the vacation of streets and alleys and the dedication of the alley outlet. The adoption of the at-

tached resolution is therefore recommended.

Resolved, That all that portion of Gilbo Avenue 50 ft. wd., lying east of the southerly 159.16 ft. of Lot 176, west of the southerly 159.29 ft. of Lot 175 and north of Molena (Brunswick) Avenue; also all of Molena Avenue 30 ft. wd., from the westerly line of Gilbo Ave. extended southerly, easterly to the easterly subdivision line, lying south of Lots 154 through 175, all in Bolton Sub. of Lots 11-12, 14 and 15 of Leander Rivard Farm Sub., Hamtramck Twp., part of Fractional Section 15 T. 1 S., R. 12 E., Liber 37, pg. 36, W.C.R., be and the same are hereby vacated as public streets to become part and parcel of the abutting property and be it further

PROVIDED, That by reason of the vacation of the above property, the City of Detroit does not waive any rights to the sewers located or to be located therein, and, at all times, shall have the right to enter upon the premises, if found necessary to repair said sewers, alter, service or install same, and further

PROVIDED, That no building shall be constructed over said sewers without the prior approval of such building construction by the Sewer Services Section of the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department and the Department of Buildings and Safety Engineering; and further

PROVIDED, In the event that the sewer located or to be located in said property shall break, causing damage to any construction, property or materials above, the petitioners and their assigns, by acceptance of the permit for construction over said sewer, waive all claims for damages; and further

PROVIDED, that if the sewer located or to be located in said property shall break or be damaged, as a result of any action on the part of the petitioner, or assigns (by way of illustration but not limitation, such as storage of excessive weights or materials, or any construc-

tion not in accordance with Provision 2, mentioned above), then in such event, the petitioner or assigns shall be liable for all costs incidental to the repair of such broken or damaged sewer; and shall also be liable for all claims of damages resulting from this action, and be it further

Resolved, That the deed of land for alley purposes by the Chrysler Corporation to the City of Detroit being described as:
