Honorable City Council: Re: Petition 1493, Arrow Overall Company. Conversion to easement of the N-S alley lying between Concord and Canton Avenues and North of Ferry Avenue.

The above petition requests the vacation of the above described alley 18 feet wide with the reservation of an easement for the public sewer therein. The requested vacation was approved by the Community, Economic and Development Department for the Board of Education who are selling the Thomas School Building and the site to the petitioner.

This site was developed by the school board in 1905 and the building is located over the public alley rightof-way and the public sewer therein. The fact that the alley had never been formally vacated was only disclosed when the title search for the property

sale was undertaken.

The developer is proposing to remodel the building and has indicated to the Water and Sewerage Department that they will not be affecting the continued use of the public sewer lying beneath the building. All other City departments and privately owned utility companies are not affected by the vacation as they have not been located within the alley right-of-way since 1905.

The adoption of the attached resolution is recommended.

5) PROVIDED, That by reason of the vacation of the above property, the City of Detroit through its Public Lighting Department does not waive the right to maintain a transformer pole which is located in the northerly 10 feet of said vacated alley and its lines attached thereto; and further

6) PROVIDED, That should the petitioner or assigns desire to have this pole removed it will be at the petitioner's or assigns sole expanse.
