Honorable City Council:

Re: Petition No. 4689 & 2104, Detroit Board of Education, Vacation of the north-south alley in the block bounded by Marlowe, Hubbell, Midland and Pilgrim.

The above petition requests the vacation of the above described alley, 20 feet wide. The requested vacation was approved by the Community Economic and Development Department. The petition was then referred to us for investigation and report. Our report, accompanied by the original petition is as follows:

The petitioner has issued the following purchase orders to the departments named, for the purposes indicated:

Water and Sewerage Department — Purchase Order No. 21431 — \$1,000.00 for design/engineering review only on proposed sewer relocation; the construction work will be performed by the Board's contractor.

Public Lighting Department — Purchase Order No. 20039 — \$34,000 for the estimated cost to relocate lighting facilities.

The petitioner has also requested that the paved returns at the entrance to the alley to be vacated be removed by the Board's contractor and has agreed to assume all costs. The Environmental Protection and Maintenance Department has no objection to this request provided the work is done under City permit and inspection. Proper provisions are included in the attached resolution for the relocation of the existing sewer located in the alley.

All other involved City departments and privately-owned utility companies reported that they have no objection to the proposed vacation or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations therein.

The adoption of the attached resolution is recommended.

RESOLVED, That all that part of the north-south public alley, 20 feet wide, in the block bounded by Marlowe, Hubbell, Midland and Pilgrim abutting the rear line of lots 1 to 39 inclusive, having been entirely platted in Fred W. Bristow's Robson Avenue

Subdivision of part of the S. $\frac{1}{2}$ of N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of S.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 18, T. 1 S., R. 11 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan as recorded in Liber 51, Page 16, Plats, Wayne County records,

Be and the same is hereby vacated as a public alley to become a part and parcel of the abutting property; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department be and is hereby authorized to review the drawings for the lateral sewer and to issue a permit to the petitioner (No. 2104) for the construction of the lateral sewer to serve the Coleman A. Young Elementary School located in an area bounded by Marlowe, Pilgrim, Hubbell and Midland; be it further

RESOLVED, That the plans for the lateral sewer shall be prepared by a registered engineer; be it further

RESOLVED, That the entire work is to be performed approved by the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department and constructed subject to the inspection and approval of the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department; be it further

RESOLVED, That the entire cost of the lateral sewer construction including inspection, survey and engineering shall be borne by the petitioner; be it further

RESOLVED, That the petitioner shall deposit with the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department, in advance of engineering, inspection and survey, such amounts as that department deems necessary to cover the cost of these services; be it further

RESOLVED, That the petitioner shall grant to the City satisfactory easements for the lateral sewers prior to the start of construction; be it further

RESOLVED, That upon satisfactory completion of the sewer construction the lateral sewer shall be City property and become part of the City sewer system.
