Re: Petition No. 2683. Detroit Terminal Railroad Company. Vacation of Jerome Avenue west of Goddard.

The above petition requests the vacation of Jerome Avenue, 33 feet wide, west of Goddard Avenue. The requested vacation was approved by the Community and Economic Development Department.

The petition was then referred to us for investigation and report. Our report, accompanied by the original petition, is as follows:

The petitioner has made the following deposit with the City Treasurer, which has been credited to the department and account named, for the purpose indicated:

Department of Public Works - Intersection Fund. Receipt No. B 23331.



\$826.00. For the original paving of the west one-half of Goddard Avenue at the intersection with Jerome.

The petitioner has also requested that the paved return at the entrance to Jerome Avenue remain in its present status as the petitioner plans to utilize same, and has agreed by letter filed with the original petition to pay all costs incidental to the removal of same whenever the discontinuance of use makes such removal necessary.

An easement is reserved in the vacating resolution for the Michigan Consolidated Gas Company for the maintenance of its installations located in the public right of way to be vacated.

All other involved City departments and privately-owned utility companies reported that they have no objection to the proposed vacation or that they have reached satisfactory agreements with the petitioner regarding their installations therein.

The adoption of the attached resolution is recommended.

RESOLVED, That all that part of Jerome Avenue, 33 feet wide, lying between and abutting the westerly line of Goddard Avenue, 60 feet wide, and the westerly line of the 15 foot wide north-south alley west of Lumpkin Avenue, as platted in "Heathville Park" being Wilson, Paul and Farley's Subdivision of the East half of the West half of ¼ Section 2, 10,000 Acre Tract, Hamtramck, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 16, Page 63, Plats, Wayne County records; and the westerly 7.5 feet of said street having been platted as an alley in the Columbian Subdivision as recorded in Liber 18, Page 65, Plats, Wayne County records

Be and the same is hereby vacated as a public street and is hereby converted into an easement of the full width of the street for the Michigan Consolidated Gas Company, which easement shall be subject to the following covenants and agreements, uses, reservations and regulations, which shall be observed by the owners of the lots abutting on said street and by their heirs, executors, administrators and assigns, forever to wit:

FIRST, said owners hereby grant to and for the Michigan Consolidated Gas Company, an easement or right of way over said vacated public street hereinabove described for the pur-

poses of maintaining, installing, repairing, removing, or replacing utilities such as gas lines or mains, or things usually placed or installed in a public street in the City of Detroit, with the right to ingress and egress at any time to and over said easement for the purpose above set forth,

SECOND, said owners for their heirs and assigns further agree that no buildings or structures of any nature whatsoever including but not limited to concrete slabs or driveways, retaining or partition walls (except necessary line fence) shall be built or placed upon said easement, nor any change of surface grade made, without the prior approval by the Department of Public Works,

THIRD, that if at any time in the future the owners of any lots abutting on said vacated street shall request the removal and/or relocation of any existing utilities in said easement, such owners, upon whose property the utilities are located shall pay all costs incidental to such removal and/or relocation, unless such charges are waived by the utility owners,

PROVIDED FURTHER, that if any utility located or to be located in said property shall break or be damaged as a result of any action on the part of the petitioner or assigns (by way of illustration but not limitation), such as storage of excessive weights or construction not in accordance with Section 2, mentioned above, then in such event the petitioner or assigns shall be liable for all costs incidental to the repair of such broken or damaged utility; and be it further

RESOLVED, That if in the future it becomes necessary to remove the paved street return, such removal and construction of new curb and sidewalk will be done under City permit and inspection, and according to Department of Public Works specifications with all costs borne by the petitioner or his assigns, and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Finance Department be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue a Quit Claim deed to the above described property and the Law Department is directed to prepare said deed.
