The Labor Relations Division has recently reached tentative agreement on a new labor contract covering the period from July 1, 1980 to June 30, 1983 with the Emergency Mobile Medical Technicians and Trainee's Association. We are requesting that your Honorable Body approve the implementation of the first year wage increase, and shift premium provision contingent on the Union ratifying the new agreement.

Therefore, we wish to recommend that your Honorable Body amend the Official Compensation Schedule as set forth in the attached resolution. The settlement conforms to the general pattern provided other unionized and non-union employees, but includes a two year wage freeze beginning on July 1, 1981.
