Re: Petition No. 3206. Grant Trunk Railroad. Closure of Eight Grand Crossings.

On September 28, 1981 at a Committee of the Whole meeting, your Honorable Body directed that the closing of the following grade crossings be implemented. On November 4, 1981 J.C.C. p. 2653, the City accepted a deposit of \$5,000.00 from the Railroad, which sum was used for preliminary engineering work involved in closing these streets across the railroad tracks between Dequindre and St. Aubin Streets: Hale Street, St. Joseph Street, Illinois Street, Alexandrine Avenue, Superior Street, Willis Avenue, Garfield Avenue, Hancock Avenue.

The City Engineer's Office has prepared the necessary design plans for the barricading of the streets and construction of connecting roadways and turnarounds. The Railroad has deposited an additional sum of \$30,000.00 to cover the estimated costs of performing this construction work by Department of Public Works forces.

All involved City Departments and public utility companies have indicated that they have no objections to the closings of these streets and grade crossings provided utility easements are retained within the full width of the street rights of way being vacated. The Railroad has concurred with this request. In addition, the Railroad has agreed to pay all costs of removal of the railroad signals and traffic gates.

The attached resolution is submitted for your Honorable Body's consideration. This resolution vacates portions of the streets across the railroad tracks with utility easements retained and sets aside those City owned parcels required for connecting roadways and turnarounds.

The adoption of this resolution is recommended.

FIRST, said railroad hereby grant to and for the use of public utilities an easement or right of way over said vacated public streets herein above described for the purposes of maintaining, installing, repairing, removing, or replacing public utilities such as water mains, sewers, gas lines or mains, telephone, electric light conduits or poles or things usually placed or installed in a public street in the City of Detroit, with the right to ingress and egress at any time to and over said easements for the purpose above set forth,

SECOND, said railroad for its heirs and assigns further agree that no buildings or structures of any nature whatsoever shall be built or placed upon said easement, nor any change of surface grade made, without prior approval by the Department of Public Works,

THIRD, that if at any time in the future the railroad shall request the removal and/or relocation of any existing poles or other utilities in said easements, shall pay all costs incidental to such removal and/or relocation, unless such charges are waived by the utility owners,

PROVIDED FURTHER That if any

utility located or to be located in said property shall break or be damaged as a result of any action on the part of the petitioner or assigns (by way of illustration but not limitation), such as storage of excessive weights of materials or construction not in accordance with Section 2, mentioned above, then in such event the petitioner or assigns shall be liable for all costs incidental to the repair of such broken or damaged utility.
