Re: Petition 1640 — Chicago Beef Company requesting renewal for 5 years the alley closing at Adelaide, Division and Gratiot.

Investigation disclosed that the grant for the temporary closing of the above described alley has expired and the petitioner now wishes an extension of time. There have been no complaints since this alley closing has been in effect and no change in the conditions.

The Department of Transportation, Planning and Traffic Engineering Division and other interested City Departments have been contacted and there are no objections to the extension of time.

After careful consideration of all the factors involved, it is the recommendation of the Community & Economic Development Department that the temporary closing of the alley, as shown on the plan #A-3788 be extended for an additional five (5) year period subject to all the provisions as they apply to the extension of a temporary closing.

Resolved, That the City Engineering Department be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permit to Chicago Beef Company, owner of the property adjoining the alley herein concerned, to extend the closing of the east-west alley between Division and Adelaide, westerly of Gratiot, on a temporary basis for a period not exceeding five (5) years from December 8, 1987, in accordance with the Community and

Economic Development Department Plan No. A3788.

Provided, that petitioner shall be subject to any tax which may be levied against it pursuant to law with regards to such use of public property, and further

Provided, Petitioner first furnishes an Agreement, in form approved by the Law Department, saving and protecting the City of Detroit harmless from any and all claims, damages or expenses that may arise by reason of the issuance of said permit, and providing for the faithful performance by the grantee of the terms hereof, and files same with the Finance Department, and further

Provided, that said permit shall be issued only after a certified copy of this resolution has been duly recorded in the office of the Wayne County Register of Deeds, by and at the permittee's expense, and further

Provided, That no building or other structure is constructed in said alley; that petitioner shall observe the rules and regulations of the City Engineering Department, and further subject to the following provisions:
