Ized the Finance Director to establish Appropriation No. 7522 in the amount of \$224,000 for landscaping of the East Grand Boulevard-East Jefferson intersection. The landscaping enhances the entrance to Belle Isle.

On March 23, 1988 (J.C.C. pp. 704-05), Your Honorable Body authorized an increase in Appropriation No. 7522 to a new total of \$286,387 to pay for the City's share of the contract cost and construction engineering and inspection; and for Federal-aid reimbursement of the

construction engineering and inspection services performed by City forces. The increase was due to a higher bid price than the original estimated cost.

Based on the best information available from the Michigan Department of Transportation, the construction cost for the project is now estimated to be \$771,700 of which \$29,000 is not eligible for Federal-aid. The prior approved cost, anticipated cost and the resulting increase in the City's share and Federal-aid relmbursement is as follows:

Appropriation No. 7522 currently has a deficit of \$119,326 because of an increase in the cost for C.E.I. services, not eligible for Federal-aid reimbursement. Thus, an increase of \$163,939 is required in the Appropriation.

We recommend adoption of the attached resolution which authorizes the Finance Director to do the following:

- 1. Increase Appropriation No. 7522 by \$163,939 to a new total of \$450,326 of which \$3,054 will be Federal-aid reimbursable, and transfer \$160,885 from Appropriation No. 4189, Major Street Fund-Traffic Control Improvements, to Appropriation No. 7522 to cover the \$119,926 deficit and to cover the \$41,059 increase in the local share.
- 2. Increase the anticipated revenue for Appropriation No. 7522 by \$3,054 to a new total of \$83,600 for Federal-aid reimbursement of the construction engineering and inspection work performed by City forces.
- 3. Increase the contract amount for City Contract No. 64643 by \$35,108 for a new total contract amount of \$214,700.

Resolved, That the existing sewer easement also located south of Grand River between Livernois and Woodside Avenues retained by City Council resolution of August 2, 1927, page 2249, and June 5, 1951, page 1353, for the vacation of the public alley 20 feet wide, south of Grand River and east of Livernois, described as lying south of and adjoining the south line of the west 10.0 feet of Lot 9 and also the south line of lots 10 to 13. both inclusive, of Lerchen's Addition to Greenfield Village on Fractional Sec. 34, T.1S., R.11E., as recorded in Liber 12, page 79 of Plats of Wayne County Records, be and the same is hereby vacated as a sewer easement, with the sewer located therein reverting to the Petitioner and no longer being City of Detroit responsibility subject to the following provisions:

Provided, That the Petitioner (No. 1592) shall relocate that portion of the existing lateral sewer located in the latter sewer easement as required by the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department for the construction of the proposed car wash at 9600 Livernois prior to construction of the car wash; and further

Provided, That the portion of the existing lateral sewer not relocated due to construction shall remain as City property and part of the City System; and fur-

Provided, That the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department be and is hereby authorized to review the drawings for the relocated lateral sewer and to issue a permit for the construction of the lateral sewer; and further

Provided, That the plans for the lateral sewer shall be prepared by a registered Engineer; and further

Provided, That the entire work is to be performed in accordance with plans and specifications approved by the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department, and constructed subject to the inspection and approval of the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department; and further

Provided, That the entire cost of the lateral sewer construction, including inspection, survey and engineering shall be borne by the Petitioner; and further
