

**A Resolution to Pay Additional Compensation for Service as Interim Director to Board of Zoning Appeals**  
By Council Member Hood:

Whereas, Ms. Antoinette C. Lett, Assistant Director of the Board of Zoning Appeals, was appointed by the City Council to be Interim Director of the Board of Zoning Appeals on December 10, 1990, until such time as the City Council appointed a director of the board of Zoning Appeals; and

Whereas, Ms. Lett served as Interim Director from December 10, 1990 to April 1, 1991 without any additional compensation for assuming the responsibilities of Director; and

Whereas, The Detroit Manual of Standard Personnel Practices sets forth guidelines to pay employees "out-of-class" pay; additional compensation may be provided to employees performing duties outside the scope of duties of the employee's current classification and involve the application of significantly higher levels of skill and responsibility; and

Whereas, The City Council has directed that employees appointed to serve in an interim "out-of-classification" position will be paid the higher rate during the period served as an interim. Now Therefore Be It

Resolved, The City Council directs that Ms. Antoinette C. Lett receive the additional compensation for the period from December 10, 1990 to April 1, 1991, at the minimum rate paid to the Director of the Board of Zoning Appeals for the 1990-91 fiscal year.

Re: Petition No. 2008, Michigan-Department of Military Affairs, Wayne County Olympia Armory Site. Easements to Vacation in the area bounded by Grand River, Lawton, McGraw, and Wreford.

Petition No. 2008 of the "State of Michigan — Department of Military Affairs" requests the outright vacation of the remaining public utility easements retained within various converted public rights-of-way at the old Olympia Stadium site. Generally, the site is bounded by Grand River, Lawton, McGraw, and Wreford Avenues.

The conveyance of city-owned land to the Michigan — Department of Military Affairs was approved by your Honorable Body on December 13, 1985 (J.C.C.

pages 2808-09). However, to develop the site as proposed it is necessary to adjust (or remove) provisions protecting utility installations reserved within several (previous) resolutions adopted by City Council.

The petition was referred to the City Engineering Department (by the Community and Economic Development Department) for investigation (utility clearances) and report. This is our report:

Satisfactory arrangements have been made with the Public Lighting Department, Water and Sewerage Department, and the Detroit Edison Company.

An appropriate resolution is attached for consideration by your Honorable Body.

Re: Petition No. 2327. Redford-Kentfield Congregation(s) of Jehovah's Witnesses, et al. Alley to Vacation and Easement remaining east-west public alley south of Fenkell between Kentfield and Heyden.

Petition No. 2327 of the "Redford-Kentfield Congregation(s) of Jehovah's Witnesses, et al" requests the conversion of the remaining east-west public alley, 20 and 40 feet wide, south of Fenkell Avenue between Kentfield and Heyden Avenues into an easement for public utilities; also the vacation of a 3.00 feet by 64.00 feet portion of said public alley to maintain an existing canopy structure.

The requested conversion and vacation was approved by the Community and Economic Development Department. The petition was referred to the City Engineering Department for investigation (utility clearances) and report. This is our report:
