· Pension, hospitalization, and other fringe benefit costs being charged at a higher level than provided for in the bud-

 Secret service expenditures being incurred at a substantially higher level

than in recent years, and

 The deployments of personnel in different patterns than were contemplated at

the time the budget was adopted.

In order to remedy these imbalances and allow the Police Department to continue its operations through the balance of the current fiscal year, it will be necessary to transfer funds between appropriations. The attached resolution has been prepared for the consideration of your Honorable Body, and its adoption is recommended.
