Re: Departmental Recommendation on Residential Alley Vacation for Petitions Numbers: 742, 934, 1006

and 1017.

The above-referenced four (4) petitions were presented by the Planning and Development Department (P&DD) for consideration at a public hearing before your Honorable Body on April 9, 2007. Six (6) petitions were presented at this public hearing. Following public comments, two (2) petitions were put on hold, Petition No.

342 and Petition No. 872 respectively, and will be brought back to the City Council under a separate cover.

Attached herewith, is the resolution that will enable the City Council to take formal action causing the vacation of the above-referenced four petitions.

These petitions have been processed in compliance with the Detroit Code, Article VI, Section 50-6-1. Our investigation of each alley location discloses the following:

- 1. The public utilities located in the alley can be properly served if this alley is converted into an easement.
- 2. That the alley does not serve as the sole means of ingress/egress to abutting properties.
- 3. No objections to this alley vacation have been received from any impacted utility companies and city agencies.

Therefore, it is the recommendation of

the Planning and Development Department that the attached Resolution be approved.

PETITION No. 742 (2006)

CONVERSION TO EASEMENT OF THE NORTH-SOUTH ALLEY, IN THE BLOCK BOUNDED BY OHIO, CHERRYLAWN, SANTA CLARA AND THATCHER;

RESOLVED, all that part of the North-South public alley, 18 feet wide, lying West of and abutting the West line of Lots 162 thru 169, both inclusive; also, lying East of and abutting the East line of Lots 200 thru 207, both inclusive, all in SEYMOUR & TROESTER'S LOYOLA PARK SUBDIVISION, being a part of the SW 1/4 of Section 9, T. 1 S., R. 11 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 45, Page 41 of Plats, Wayne County Records;

ALSO included, is that southerly portion of the same North-South public alley, lying West of and abutting the West line of Lots 245 thru 251, both inclusive, also lying East of and abutting the East line of Lots 207 thru 214, both inclusive, in SANTA MARIA PARK, a Subdivision of part of the SW 1/4 of Section 9, T. 1 S., R. 11 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 48, Page 10 of Plats, Wayne County Records.

lying North of and abutting the North line of Lots 213 thru 217, both inclusive, all in SCHULTE'S ACADEMY MANOR SUBDIVISION of the S 1/2 of S 1/2 of NE 1/4 of Section 8, T. 1 S., R. 11 E., City of Detroit and Greenfield Township, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 46, Page 94 of Plats, Wayne County Records;

Subject alley, shall be equally divided between the abutting properties adjoining the alley and platted within the above Schulte's Academy Manor Subdivision.

RESOLVED, all that part of the North-South public alley, 16 feet wide, lying West of and abutting the West line of Lots 228 thru 239, both inclusive; also, lying East of and abutting the East line of Lots 290 thru 301, both inclusive; all in GLENDALE GARDEN SUBDIVISION of the West-half of the Northeast Quarter of Section 29, T. 1 S., R. 11 E., Greenfield Township, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 33, Page 24 of Plats, Wayne County Records;

Subject alley, shall be equally divided between abutting properties adjoining the alley and platted within the above-mentioned Subdivisions.

PETITION No. 1017 (2006)

CONVERSION TO EASEMENT OF THE EAST-WEST ALLEY, IN THE BLOCK BOUNDED BY HAYES AVENUE, BROCK, LIBERAL AND MANNING;

RESOLVED, all that part of the East-West public alley, 18 feet wide, lying North of and abutting the North line of Lots 155 thru 168, both inclusive; also, lying South of and abutting the South line of Lots 169 thru 182, both inclusive, all in EAST HAVEN SUBDIVISION of the West 40 acres of the SW 1/4 of Section 6, T. 1 S., R. 13 E., City of Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan, as recorded in Liber 53, Page 5 of Plats, Wayne County Records;

Subject alley, shall be equally divided between the abutting properties adjoining the alley and platted within East Haven Subdivision.

RESOLVED, That the alleys or the portions thereof described above are vacated, subject to the following permanent conditions and shall be construed as a covenant running with the land and shall be binding upon the Grantee named herein and the successors and assigns thereof

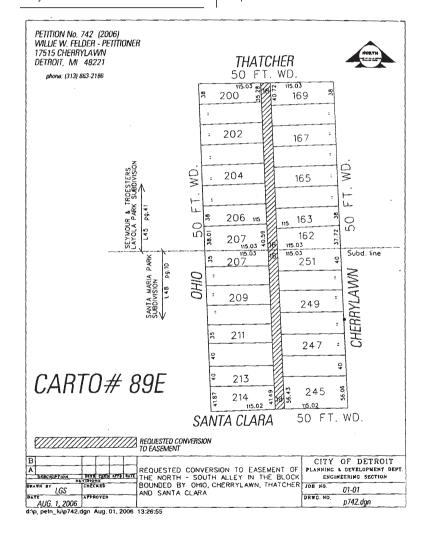
1. The City reserves an easement on the entire width of the vacated alley for purposes of inspecting, installing, maintaining, replacing or repairing public utilities in a public alley. 2. No buildings, structures, improvements or encroachments of any kind (except line fences) may be placed in the easement area without prior consent of the City Engineering Division of the Department of Public Works.

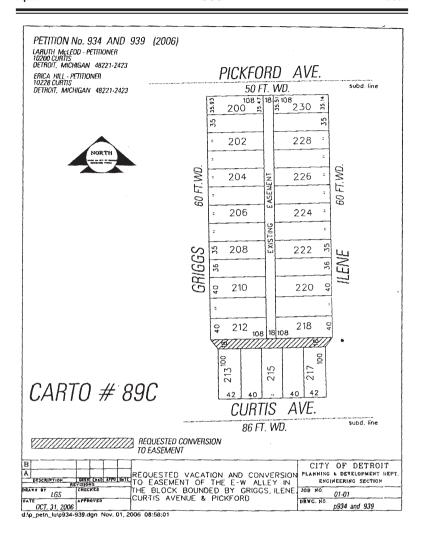
3. That, if the owners of any lots abutting on said vacated alley shall request the removal and/or relocation of any existing poles or other utilities in said easements, such owners shall pay all costs incidental to such removal or relocation, unless such charges are waived by the utility owners.

Resolved, That in accordance with MCL Section 560.256 and City Code Section 50-7-4, the City Clerk is directed to record a certified copy of this Resolution with the Wayne County Register of Deeds within thirty (30) days after the effective date of this Resolution; and be it further

Resolved, That upon the receipt of a copy of the Resolution, the City Engineer shall correct the Official City Maps and Records:

A Waiver of Reconsideration is requested.

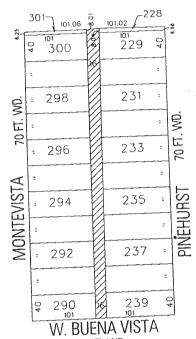

Honorable City Council:

Re: Property For Sale By Purchase Agreement and Development Agreement — Exhibit 4 Development: Parcel 246A; located on the east side of 14th Street between Bagley & Howard & Parcel 246B; located on the south side of the former Michigan Central Rail Corridor extending between 20th St. & W. Fort St.

We are in receipt of an offer from Detroit River Tunnel Partnership, an Ontario Partnership, to purchase the above-captioned property and to develop such property. This vacant land along with the easement property contains approximately 901,959 square feet or 20.7 acres and is zoned M-4 (Intensive Industrial District).

The Detroit River Tunnel Partnership proposes to use this property in conjunction with their adjacent property to develop a new single-track rail tunnel under the Detroit River to accommodate their rail-road business expansion. The proposal for the development of Parcel 246A and Parcel 246B has been presented to the Detroit Housing Commission and approved by that Body on June 19, 2003. This use is permitted as a matter of right in a M-4 zone.
