Your Petitioner, St. John Hospital & Medical Center (St. John), a Michigan non-profit corporation, of 22101 Moross Road, Michigan 48236-2172, hereby petitions the City Council for appropriate approvals

(a) to vacate with easements Linville Avenue as a public street from Kingsville Avenue on the north to the vacated portion of Linville on the south, approximately 106 lineal feet.

In support of this Petition, the following information is submitted:

- 1. St. John is currently constructing an addition to its West Parking Structure on Moross at Linville to enhance its ability to continue providing state of the art medical care and service to the citizens of Detroit. A new vehicular entrance and exit on the Linville avenue side of the Structure is currently being constructed. Together with the neighboring residents, St. John Hospital wishes to remove the remaining portion of Linville Avenue.
- 2. St. John is the owner of all lots fronting on the east side of Linville between Kingsville and McCormick. The Hospital has a signed purchase agreement to acquire the lot on the west side of Linville at the Kingsville intersection.
- 3. Plans for the vacating of Linville and creation of a cul-de-sac on McCormick have been approved by the Detroit City Council and are incorporated herein for reference.

4. St. John shall pay for all construction costs and fees appropriately required for the vacating

with easements of Linville at Kingsville.

5. Meetings with residents living on Linville and McCormick as well as the adjacent

neighborhoods, including Harper Woods and Grosse Pointe Woods, have taken place to

better acquaint them with the proposed development and the proposed landscaping plan.

6. St. John shall pay for any costs appropriately required for the relocation and / or adjustment

of utilities and shall reserve onto the City any easements required for public utilities.

7. St. John's development plan provides for construction to commence in spring, 1998,

St. John, therefore, respectfully requests that this Petition be submitted to the requisite

departments for approval and that the City adopt appropriate resolutions approving the matters

described herein.
