

Honorable City Council,

Please regard this communication to be a request to "vacate and convert to easement" two partial streets located within the American Red Cross Campus, 100 Mack Avenue, Detroit, Michigan. The American Red Cross owns all properties adjoining the sites requested to be vacated.

The Request

The two sites are identified on the attached site plan as the campus currently exists. The vacation and conversion to easement are as follows:

- 1. Vacate southern half of the alley between Mack Avenue and Eliot Street. The northern half of the alley has already been vacated and changed to easement and is part of the campus plan. This request relates to the portion of the alley behind the "print shop" on the attached map. (The old print shop is now a Red Cross Training center)
- 2. Vacate and conversion to easement the remainder of Eliot Street from Woodward Avenue to the north/ south alley. The eastern portion of the Eliot has already been vacated and changed to easement and is part of the campus operations.

This request is based on two important needs of the American Red Cross:

- 1. The American National Red Cross has asked Red Cross Blood Regions to improve security to facilities as a result of the September 11, 2001 event in New York. We have reviewed our campus security and believe these changes are necessary to assure the safety of blood supply in Southeastern Michigan. This is the immediate need and is critical to our existing operations.
- 2. The Chapter plans to build an additional building on the site in several years. At this time the same changes to easement will facilitate expansion of facilities and services offered to this community.
