**Re: Encroachment Permit Request to Install/Maintain Monitoring Wells in Right-of-Way.
Amoco Service Station No. 5631, 4125 East Eight Mile Road, Detroit, MI**

Dear City Council:

Delta Environmental Consultants (Delta), on behalf of their client, BP Products North America, Inc. (BP), is requesting an encroachment permit for the installation of Leaking Underground Storage Tank (L.U.S.T.) monitoring wells in the public alleyway located south of 4125 East Eight Mile Road, Detroit, MI.

The purpose of installing L.U.S.T. monitoring wells is to extend environmental investigation already occurring at the Amoco Service Station No. 5631 located at 4125 East Eight Mile Road, Detroit, MI. A confirmed release related to the underground storage tanks at this location was reported to the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality – Remediation and Redevelopment Division (MDEQ – RRD). Installation of monitoring wells to determine the extent of impact is essential for the completion of the corrective action required by the MDEQ – RRD

Delta and its client propose the installation of one monitoring well in the alleyway south of the subject site. Delta currently has a monitoring well (OW-13) in the alleyway. Monitoring well OW-13 was installed in 1994 under Petition No. 239. Monitoring well will be over drilled and a new well will be installed. Please see the attached map for the approximate proposed locations.

Delta anticipates moving forward with the installation of this well as soon as permission is granted by the City Council. Following installation, the monitoring wells will be sampled on a regular basis for a period of one year to five years. The duration of the monitoring wells will be dependent on the findings of the environmental investigation.

Enclosed is a site plan including the approximate proposed monitoring well location, a uniform surety bond, and a schematic drawing of a monitoring well.


