Dear Mr. Scott:

Please find enclosed, information and material necessary to perform soil borings and their conversion to monitoring wells in the right-of-ways of the alleyway adjacent to Van Dyke Avenue, along Van Dyke Avenue and along Mack Avenue for the Shell Oil banded retail station located at 7961 Mack Avenue, Detroit, Wayne County, Michigan as shown on Figure 1.

In accordance with the enclosed letter received from the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ), Shell has determined that to satisfy MDEQ requirements, nine monitoring wells must be installed in the right-of-ways, to collect soil and water samples for analysis including soil type. Please refer to the enclosed Figure 1 for locations.

An air knife/hand auger and a Geoprobe<sup>TM</sup> 66DT hydraulic push and/or a hollow stem auger drilling rig will be used to install the soil borings to a depth of approximately 20-ft bgs and then conversion of the soil borings into monitoring wells. The proposed well construction is shown on the enclosed Figure 2.

Shell understands that any disturbed areas within the ROW must be finished to match the existing grade and that upon completion of the need for these monitoring wells, the monitoring wells would be removed in accordance with MDEQ rules and the monitoring well location repaired to match the pre-existing conditions per current City of Detroit standards and specifications. MISS-DIG will be notified at least 72 hours before the commencement of the work.





Final Assessment Report: Time Extension Denial

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter received May 15, 2006, requesting an extension of time for your submittal of a Final Assessment Report (FAR) for the release of a regulated substance from your underground storage tank (UST) system. The Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ), Remediation and Redevelopment Division (RRD), may grant an extension of reporting time frames for good cause, pursuant to Section 21313a(3) of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451).

Based upon the review of the reasons for an extension, the RRD has determined that the basis of your request does not constitute good cause, and that granting an extension of time is not appropriate. For a number of years, measurable free product was present in the UST cavity tank pit wells, all of which are located on the end of the UST cavity close to the station building. Given this, there has yet to be any investigations conducted on the west side of the tank cavity or underneath the station building along the west side of the UST cavity. In addition, soil samples collected from within the UST cavity exhibited concentrations which exceeded the soil saturation screening levels. Section 21307 specifically requires initial response actions to address contamination that is likely to cause a fire hazard or spread and increase the cost of correction action. To date, no source control activities or investigations have been performed to address the cause of the release or the maximum contaminant concentrations on-site and the risk posed to public health, safety, welfare, or the environment.



In addition, based on the city of Detroit's April 24, 2006, denial of access to the off-site property, it will be necessary for you to initiate legal action before April 24, 2007, pursuant to Section 20135a in order to gain access and conduct the required investigations. Once access is granted, you should expedite the submittal of the FAR. Please note the use of fate and transport calculations is not appropriate unless the full extent of soil and groundwater contamination has been determined:

Should you fail to initiate court ordered access and submit the required reports within the specified timeframe, the RRD may pursue escalated enforcement actions against you, including the imposition of administrative penalties for late reports, red-tagging the tanks at the subject facility to prohibit delivery of product, or other enforcement actions to compel compliance with Act 451.
