

Honorable City Council: Re: Petition No. 3897, Faygo Beverages, .Inc. Request to temporary close portion of Superior Street between Moran and Gratiot. ...

We are returning herewith petitions No. 3897 of Faygo Beverages. Inc., re-

questing temporary closing of a portion of Superior Street between Moran and Gratiot.

The request was approved by the Community and Economic Development Department with certain restrictions. As directed by your Honorable Body in the public hearing on November 7, 1985, the City Planning Commission held a Faygo - community meeting on November 27, 1985. The City Planning Commission has concurred with the recom-mendations of the Community and Economic Development Deaprtment.

The petitioner has agreed (as stated in their original letter) to install manned gates at both ends of the requested street closure. These gates will be manned during the petitioner's normal operating hours, between 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight; also during the normal operating hours of the two businesses to the east of Faygo properties on the south side of Superior. Additionally, the gates will be signaldevice-equipped to facilitate emergency vehicle access during non-operating

If the petition is granted, the Department of Transportation has agreed to revert the open portions of Superior and Willis to two-way traffic, leaving parking on the south side of Willis, between Moran and Mt. Elliott.

All other City departments and privately owned utility companies have reported they have no objections to the proposal, provided they have the right to ingress and egress at all times to their facilities.

An appropriate resolution containing the necessary conditions is attached for consideration by your Honorable Body.

Resolved, That the City Engineering-Department be and it is hereby authorized and directed to issue permits to Faygo Beverages, Inc. to close all that part of Superior Street, 50 feet wide, between Moran Street and Mt. Elliott Avenue, the centerline of which is described as follows: Beginning at a point on the east line extended northerly on the north-south (vacated) public alley, 18 feet wide, first east of Moran Street, said point being 25 feet north of the south line of Superior Street, 50 feet wide; thence easterly and parallel to said south line of Superior Street 390,00 feet, more or less, to a point of ending, contained in the following subdivisions:

1) Harriet L. Haworth's Subdivision of the North part of Outlots 1 and 2, Private Claim 182, Maurice Moran Farm, as recorded in Liber 8, Page 63, Plats, Wayne County Records;

2) Plat of the Subdivision of part of Outlot 1 of the Subdivision of Private Claim 182 as recorded in Liber 9, Page 95, Plats, Wayne County Records;

3) all that part of Superior Street 50 feet wide, which was opened by Circuit Court proceedings, File numbers 603 and 661 in 1887 and 1890 for street purposes, being all that part of the Rear Concession of Private Claim 182 Northwest of Gratiot Road, partly

street purposes, being part of Lot 19 of Subdivision of the Leib Farm between River and rear lines of Private Claims as recorded in Liber 45, Page 664 of Deeds, 665 and 666 Deeds, 667 Deeds, Wayne County Records, on a temporary basis to expire on February 1, 1991,

Provided, petitioner furnishes an agreement in form approved by the Law Department, saving and protect-ing the City of Detroit harmless from any and all claims, damages or expenses that may arise by reason of the issuance of said permit, and providing for the faithful performance by the grantee of the term hereof, and files same with the Finance Department, and further

Provided, That said permit shall be issued only after a certified copy of this resolution has been duly recorded in the office of the Wayne County Register of Deeds by and at the permittee's expense, and further

Provided, the Grantee shall acquire no implied or other privileges not expressly stated herein; and further

Provided, That the property owned by petitioner and adjoining the temporary street closing shall be subject to the proper zoning or regulated use (Board of Zoning Appeals Grant) over the total width and length of said street, and further

Provided, That no building or other structure is constructed in said street; that petitioner shall observe the rules of the City Engineering Department; and further the City of Detroit retains all rights and interests in the area herein temporarily closed; the City and all utility companies retain their rights to establish, maintain, and service any utilities in said area of temporarily closed street, and further

Provided, That at the expiration of . said permit, all obstructions therein shall be removed at the expense of the grantee, and the public property af-fected shall be restored to a condition satisfactory to the City Engineering Department, by and at the permittee's expense, and further

Provided, That this, grant may be revoked at the will, whim and caprice of the City Council without cause; and if this grant is continued for the five (5) year period, the City Council may, upon request and if the circumstances justify accordingly, grant an extension thereto.
