We are an established restaurant, currently operating under the name Centre Park, located at 1407 Randolph St, Detroit, MI 48226. We are requesting a petition for easement and/or encroachment for Harmonie Park Entry Plaza, located at the intersection of Randolph St. and Gratiot Ave. (Attachment A1 – A3), to have exclusive use of the plaza during normal hours of operation to service customers on the plaza. Submitted herewith is the City Planning commission's staff report relative to the above captioned matter. The City Engineering Department has submitted a resolution to effectuate the requested dedication.

The Downtown Development Authority's modified Tax increment Finance Plan for Development Area No. includes the Harmonie Park/Madison Avenue Area project which involves the acquisition and demolition of property to provide for the construction of a landscaped entry plaza into Randolph Street, and various other public improvements. The Plan also indicates the use of Cityowned land for the widening of Randolph Street north of Gratiot Avenue for the plaza entry.

Upon discussion of the proposal with CEDD and DDA staff, it was clarified that the recommended configuration of the Randolph entry plaza will require the use of only Lot 114, and not Lot 114 and 115 as indicated in the City Engineering Department resolution. Lot 115 will continue in possession of CEDD, with properties further east continuing as parking, with future development possible.

The City Planning Commission staff has attached a revised resolution to this effect and recommends its approval.


