Re: City Council Petition Request for Fitzgerald Neighborhood Signs in the Right of Way

To Whom It May Concern,

We would like to request approval to erect five (5) signs in the public right-of-way between the sidewalk and the street in the Fitzgerald neighborhood. The signs are neighborhood identity ground signs. They are designed by the Detroit Collaborative Design Center (DCDC) at the University of Detroit Mercy (UDM) in collaboration with the Fitzgerald neighborhood, constructed by DCDC and the Brightmoor Woodworkers at the Detroit Community Schools, and will be installed by a licensed contractor. The design, dimensions and specifications of the signs are attached.

The installation will take place in Fall 2015 in the Fitzgerald neighborhood, bounded by McNichols Road to the north, M-10 to the west, Fenkell Avenue to the south and Livernois Avenue to the east. The exact locations are illustrated in the attached maps and images. The adjacent addresses and property information are listed below:

15926 James Couzens Fwy. - Properties adjacent to sign location are vacant. No response in person or via phone number posted.

10001 W. McNichols Rd. – CVS general manager provided verbal consent and support for the sign.

16598 Wyoming St. – Letter of support submitted from adjacent property, Consulting Engineering Associates. The previous sign was recently vandalized and destroyed.

16812 Greenlawn Ave. – Letter of support submitted from adjacent residents.

15458 Greenlawn Ave. – Adjacent properties are vacant, nearest occupied home is owned by the Detroit Land Bank Authority.

Additional attachments include emails of approval from the Traffic Engineering Department and the Planning and Development Department and letters of support signed by property owners adjacent to the right-of-way locations, as appropriate and indicated above. The signs meet City code requirements and have been approved by the Buildings, Safety Engineering and Environmental Department. The Department of Public Works has also expressed support and approval for the project and a Right of Way permit is pending.

These signs contribute to neighborhood revitalization and community spirit and have been developed in partnership with the community. Many of the surrounding neighborhoods already have signs in place. We hope you will approve this request.





Thanks so much for reviewing the Fitzgerald Neighborhood signs and helping us navigate the permitting process. The PDF included in Mr.Doherty's email is outdated, so I wanted to provide a bit more background information.

We are now looking at FIVE right-of-way sites for the Fitzgerald neighborhood signs, which are indicated in the map I have attached here. The signs were identified as a neighborhood need through a community process. The final design, color and wording for the signs (also attached here) were developed in collaboration with community representatives, and the design reflects their desire for a traditional neighborhood sign (much like those in other nearby neighborhoods) with a modern/minimal aesthetic. The materials specified are highly weatherproof and regularly used for exterior signs and the design meets city code requirements. We would love landscaping to surround the signs but neither we nor the community have the bandwidth to maintain a flower bed and did not want to assume that the City has the capacity either. The signs will be installed by a local licensed contractor and fabricated in partnership with the Brightmoor Woodworkers.

We are trying to pursue all proper permission processes. So far Traffic Engineering, BSEED, adjacent property owners and staff at encroachment and right-of-way divisions have issued their approval and support. The Fitzgerald Neighborhood Signs are part of a project funded by the Surdna Foundation. We hope we will hear back on this final round of permissions soon, as we have a grant deadline and fabrication of the signs is underway.
