Giffels Webster - Request for a series of encroachments within the Cass Avenue, Lafayette Blvd, and Washington Blvd rights-of-way.

Giffels Webster, 28 W. Adams, Suite 1200, Detroit, Michigan 48226 on behalf of Bedrock Management Services, LLC, 630 Woodward Avenue, Detroit, Michigan, 48226 respectfully requests to encroach into the public right-of-way at 321 West Lafayette which is bounded by Cass Avenue, Lafayette Blvd, Washington Blvd, and the east/west alley south of Lafayette Boulevard.

We are requesting a below ground encroachment along the west, east, north, and south walls of the building for the existing vault areaway. This encroachment will be 20.5 feet below grade and extend 8 feet into the Cass Avenue right-of-way, 13 feet into the Lafayette Boulevard right-of-way, 9 feet into the Washington Boulevard right-of-way, and 3 feet into the alley right-of-way bounded by Cass Avenue and Washington Boulevard.

We are also requesting an encroachment for the structural vent grating for the existing vault areaway along the Cass Avenue right-of-way. The encroachment extends 8 feet into the Cass Avenue right-of-way and begins 20 feet northwest of the southwest corner of the property line and continues northwest 75 feet.

Finally, we are requesting an encroachment from the property line to the curb line for a section of stamped concrete sidewalk and integrated snow-melt system starting 82 feet northeast of the northwest corner of the property line and ending 82 feet southwest of the northwest corner of the property line on the Lafayette side of the building.

These encroachments will neither impede pedestrian nor vehicular traffic, nor will they interfere with the maintenance of the public rights-of-way, including utility company and Fire Department access. Obtaining these encroachments is critical to fully utilize the sides of the building. Drawings of the proposed locations of the encroachments are attached.




