Gentlemen—Your Committee on Street Openings, to whom was referred the matter of the verdict of a jury in the Recorder's Court, in the matter of opening Stanley avenue from Crawford street to Seventh street, respectfully report that they have examined the same and are of the opinion that the property in that locality is largely benefited by the improvement and should bear a portion of the expense of making the same. Resolved, That the Common Council of the City of Detroit do hereby fix and determine that the following district and portion of said City of Detroit, to wit: Lots "A," also lots 1 to 14 inclusive, lots 23 to 36 inclusive and the rear part of 19 to 22 inclusive of Collins B. Hubbard's subdivision of out lots 44, 45 and 46 and part of out lots 43 and 47 of the subdivision of the Labrosse farm north of Grand River avenue; lot 4 of Crane & Wesson's subdivision of the Labrosse farm south of Holden road; all that part of the Baker farm included in the following description: Town lots 1 to 16 inclusive, of Mc Hister's subdivision of part of out lots 40 and 41 north of Grand River avenue; the north 131.26 feet of out lot 40; lots 1 to 12 inclusive of Herbert Bowen's subdivision of part of outlots 40 and 41; lots 12, 13, 14 and 15 of Pulford's subdivision of part of outlots 39 and 40, all being part of the Baker farm north of Grand River avenue; outlot 24 and the south 100 feet of outlot 25 of the Forsyth farm; lots 9 to 24, inclusive, and lots 41 to 43, inclusive, of Hodges Bros.' subdivision of outlot 114 of the Woodbridge farm, private claims 22 and 248; lots 57 to 66, inclusive, also lots 79 to 88, inclusive, also lots 145, 146, 147, 148, 149 and 113, all in Woodbridge subdivision of outlots 112, 113 and 115 of the subdivision of the Woodbridge farm is benefited by the opening of Stanley avenue from Crawford street to Seventh street where not already opened.

And further resolved, That there be assessed and levied upon the several pieces and parcels of real estate included in the above description the amount of \$3,300, in proportion, as near as may be, to the advantage which such lot or parcel is deemed to acquire by such improvement.

And further resolved, That the Board of Assessors of said City of Detroit be and they are hereby directed to proceed forthwith to make an assessment roll, in conformity with the requirements of the Charter of the City of Detroit, relating to special assessments for collecting the expense of public improvements when a street is graded, comprising the property hereinbefore described, upon which they shall assess and levy the amount of \$3,300, each lot or parcel to be assessed a ratable proportion, as near as may be, of said amount in accordance to the amount of benefit derived by such improvements.

AN ORDINANCE changing the names of certain of the streets of the City of Detroit.
It is hereby ordained by the people of the City of Detroit:

SECTION 1. That the names of the streets and highways in the City of Detroit included in the following list are hereby changed and they shall hereafter be known and designated in accordance with these changes following:
