AN ORDINANCE changing the names of certain of the streets of the City of Detroit.

It is hereby ordained by the people of the City of Detroit.

SECTION 1. That the names of the streets and highways in the City of Detroit included in the following list are hereby changed and they shall hereafter be known and designated in accordance with the changes following.
