

COMMON COUNCIL

(OFFICIAL).

Detroit, Tuesday, May 7, 1901.

The Council was called to order by the President, Hon. Jacob J. Haarer. Present—Ald. Atkinson, Beamer, Campbell, Deimel, Freda, Hansjosten, Hillger, Houghton, Jerome, Joy, Keating, Koenig, Lemke, Liphardt, McGuire, Magee, Marx, Miller, Mohn, Reinhardt, Smith, Snow, Steiger, Tossy, Weber, Weibel, Weiler, Wildman and the President.

There being a quorum present, the Council was declared to be in session. The Journal of the last regular (including special) session was approved.

Third Reading of Ordinances.

Ald. Joy moved to take from the table an ordinance laid over April 23, 1901, entitled, "An ordinance relative to granting licenses to night lunch wagons," which motion prevailed.

The title to the ordinance was then read a third time.
