

Curbstone, new, straight, 430 lineal feet, more or less.

Curbstone, circular, 25.12 lineal feet, in 4 Medina circles, 4 feet radius. (reset) circles furnished by city, set by contractor.

Curbstone, Medina, reset, 1722 lineal feet, more or less.

Paving, cedar block, 2742.85 square yards, more or less.

Concrete under paving 2742.85 square yards, more or less.

Curbstone, circular, 163.28 lineal feet, in 4 Medina circles, 6 feet radius, 8 Medina circles, 10 feet radius, circles furnished by city, set by contractor.

Curbstone, Berea, reset, 1593 lineal feet, more or less.

Paving, cedar on concrete, 4458.36 square yards.

Concreting, under and behind curb, 75.39 cubic yards.

Retaining plank, 160 lineal feet.

At the junction of pavement with car track the contractor will fill void under rail heads with cement mortar, 104 lineal feet if required, without extra charge.

The time to be set in the contracts for the completion of the above paving and repaving jobs shall be as follows:

Should the Common Council fail to confirm any of the above on or before June 4, 1901, the date of completion shall be extended to cover any delay in confirmation beyond that date.

Said streets and avenues to be paved according to the specifications for cedar block on concrete, adopted by the Common Council March 16, 1900; also to the estimates of the City Engineer, as above, and the charter and ordinances of the City of Detroit.

For the above work bidders will state the price per cubic yard for excavation, price per lineal foot for curbing, price per square yard for paving or concreting, and price per lineal foot for retaining plank or stone, etc.

Bids will only be received for the entire of the work or material for any street or section of street, as per quantities stated in the estimates, and the bid will be accepted which is the lowest on aggregating the above detail regardless of any error of extension or footings made by the bidders.

Each bidder must deposit with his bid, inclosed in a separate envelope, a certified bank check payable to the order of the Department of Public Works of the City of Detroit, as follows:

Mack avenue, Sec. 2.....1,500 00
Parker avenue.....500 00
Champlain street.....350 00
Dubois street.....575 00

Which sum will be forfeited to the City of Detroit in case the bidder refuses or neglects to enter into contract for the work, subject to confirmation by the Common Council, within five days after acceptance of his tender by the Department of Public Works. Checks deposited with rejected bids will be returned to the bidder on demand.

The bidder whose tender is accepted will be required to furnish with his contract an approved surety bond to the City of Detroit in the sum of 20 per cent of the contract price for the work, conditioned on the full and faithful performance of his part of the contract.

No bids will be accepted from any person or firm who is in arrears to the City of Detroit upon debt or contract, or who is in default as surety or otherwise upon any obligation to said city.

On the proper execution of the contract bond the amount deposited with the tender will be returned to the contractor.

Printed specifications in detail for the above work are on file in the office of the Department, and copies thereof may be had on application to the Secretary.

The Department of Public Works expressly reserves the right to reject any or all proposals.

AN ORDINANCE to prevent the circulation, distribution, or giving away of papers, hand bills, cards, books or pamphlets, containing indecent or obscene matter.

It is hereby ordained by the people of the City of Detroit:

Section 1. No person shall distribute, circulate or give away, or cause to be circulated, distributed or given away any paper, hand bill, card, book or pamphlet containing indecent or obscene pictures, language or matter.

Sec. 2. Any violation of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500 and costs, and in the imposition of such fine, the court may make a further sentence that the offender may be imprisoned in the Detroit House of Correction until the payment thereof, for any period not exceeding six months.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take immediate effect.

Detroit, Tuesday, June 11, 1901.

The Council was called to order by the president, Hon. Jacob J. Haarer.
