**PROPOSALS FOR REPAVING  
STREETS.**

Sealed proposals will be received at the office of the Department of Public Works, Detroit, Mich., until Wednesday, June 26, 1901, at 10 o'clock a. m., local time, at which time and place they will be opened, for furnishing all the labor and material, and repaving, etc., the streets named below, within the limits, mentioned, in the City of Detroit, with the style of pavement stated.

**With Cedar.**

**GRANDY AVENUE**—Sec. 1, from the track in Forest avenue to the north curb line of Ferry avenue, 28 feet wide, with cedar block on concrete foundation and Berea curbstone.

**GRANDY AVENUE**—Sec. 2, from the north curb line of Ferry avenue to the east curb line of Chene street, 28 feet wide, with cedar block on concrete foundation and Medina curbstone.

**FIFTH STREET**—From the north line of Lafayette avenue to the south line of Michigan avenue, 25 feet wide, with cedar block on concrete foundation and Medina curbstone.

**FIFTH STREET**—From the brick pavement at Grand River avenue to the south curb line of Noble street, 24 feet wide, with cedar block on concrete foundation and Medina curbstone.

**CALUMET AVENUE**—From the west curb line of Commonwealth avenue to the brick pavement of Grand River avenue, 26 feet wide, with cedar block on concrete foundation and Berea curbstone.

**HANCOCK AVENUE**—From the west curb line of Greenwood avenue to the east curb line of Trumbull avenue, 26 feet wide, with cedar block on concrete foundation and Berea curbstone.

**CLINTON AVENUE**—From the brick pavement at Brush street to the west curb line of Hastings street, 24 feet wide (less single track), with cedar block on concrete foundation and Medina curbstone.

**DUBOIS STREET**—From the asphalt pavement of Jefferson avenue to the brick pavement of Monroe avenue, 26 feet wide, with cedar block on concrete foundation. Berea curbstone.

Following are the estimates in detail of the work to be done on the above repaving jobs:

**GRANDY AVENUE (Section 1).**

**City Estimates.**

Excavation, 3190 cubic yards, including old paving material, cedar on sand (stone gutters).

Curbstone, new, straight, 1,875 lineal feet, more or less.

Curbstone, circular, 50.26 lineal feet, in 2 Medina circles, 6 feet radius, 2 Medina circles, 10 feet radius, circles furnished by city, set by contractor.

Curbstone, Berea, reset, 2812 lineal feet, more or less.

Paving, cedar on concrete, 7944.80 square yards.

Concreting, under and behind curb, 126.72 cubic yards.
