To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your Committee on Parks and Boulevards, to whom was referred the communication from the Commissioner of Parks and Boulevards requesting an appropriation of \$750 for the purpose of taking care of the dirt as it arrives at the new dock constructed at the foot of the property recently acquired by the city in the extension of the Western Grand Boulevard, respectfully report that we have had the matter under consideration and upon examination find that the old dock had a frontage of but 130 feet, while the new dock is constructed the full width of the property, or about 200 feet; that in order to make the dock available for the public a large amount of filling is necessary along both sides and at the front end of the dock. The fills have been made a public dump, and in order to spread and care for the dirt as it arrives it will require the services of several men for some time. The people living in the western section of the city being anxious that the dock be available for use during the coming season, and the ferry company having signified its willingness to stop there if the dock is in condition, your committee recommend that the amount asked for be appropriated from the moneys received from the House of Correction, and therefore offer the following resolution.
