

## SIDEWALK ASSESSMENT NOTICE.

### OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF ASSESSORS,

Detroit, Mich., Dec. 19., 1904.  
To all whom it may concern:

Take notice that sidewalk assessment rolls Nos. 2006 to 2011 both inclusive for defraying the cost, and expense of constructing plank sidewalks as hereinafter described have been prepared, and are now open for inspection, revision or correction in this office, and will be presented to the Common Council at a session thereof, to be held on Tuesday, the 3rd day of January, 1905, at 7:30 p. m., city time, for confirmation.

The lot or lots described in each roll have been assessed for the cost and expense of constructing the walk in front of or adjoining the parcels named in such roll.

Roll No. 2006, Lot 15, Ward's sub of part of the Loranger farm between M. C. R. and Baker street, on the north side of Chipman place between Nineteenth street and alley east.

Roll No. 2007, Lot 523, sub. of part of Stanton farm P. C. 473 and rear concession, on the east side of Seventeenth street between Magnolia and Linden streets.

Roll No. 2008, Lot 11, Block 3, Irving place sub. on 1-4 sec. 55, 10,000 acre tract. T. I. S. R. 11 E. on the south side of Parkman avenue between Hamilton boulevard and Morrell street.

Roll No. 2009, West 25 feet lots 60 and 61, Woodbridge sub. of O. Lots 112, 113 and 115 of the sub. of Woodbridge farm on the east side of Commonwealth ave. between Stanley and Hudson avenues.

Roll No. 2010, Lots 294, 296, 297, 298, 299, 300, 301, 302, 303. Plat of Daniel Scotten's sub. of that part of P. C. 32 and east 735.9 feet of P. C. 265 lying between Fort street and the River road, T. 2 S. R. 11 E. on the west side of Dragon avenue, between Battery avenue and River street.

Roll No. 2011, Lot 138, Greusel's sub. of lots A, B, and 16 of Brush's sub. of part of P. C. 260, on the north side of Ingersoll street, between Wesson and Greusel avenues.

Any person desiring to object to any assessment so made, may, upon filing with the City Clerk at any time prior to the date last above mentioned, a written protest, be heard before the Committee on Streets, to whom such protests will be referred at a meeting thereof to be held on the Monday following such reference at 11 a. m. city time, at the Committee room, City Hall.

AN ORDINANCE to provide for the proper heating of Street Railway Cars.

It is hereby ordained by the people of the city of Detroit:

Section 1. Any person, firm or corporation, its officers, or agents, now or hereafter operating or causing to be operated any street cars over the streets and avenues of the said city, shall provide artificial heat for the

comfort of the passengers on said street cars, when the temperature of the general atmosphere shall be 35 degrees Fahrenheit or lower.

Sec. 2. Any person, firm or corporation, its officers, or agents, violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine not less than ten dollars and not more than one hundred dollars, or imprisonment in the Detroit House of Correction for a period not less than ten days nor more than three months, or both fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

Sec. 3. This ordinance shall take immediate effect.

Notice is hereby given to all persons interested that there have been filed in this office the following named assessment rolls:

### CONSTRUCTING LATERAL SEWERS.

Roll 6798. For constructing a vitrified crock lateral sewer in alley between Third and Second avenues, Boulevard and Lathrop avenues, in rear of lots 158 to 175, inclusive.

Roll 6776. For constructing a vitrified crock lateral sewer in alley running parallel to and east of Parker avenue, between Coe avenue and St. Paul avenue.

Roll 6766. For constructing a vitrified crock lateral sewer in alley in block bounded by Meldrum and Beau-fait avenue, from south line to north line of outlot 23, P. C. 13, Meldrum farm.

Roll 6792. For constructing a vitrified crock lateral sewer in alley between Van Dyke and Parker avenues, from Worcester place to 536 feet south of same.

Roll 6778. For constructing a vitrified crock lateral sewer in alley in block bounded by Parker, Maxwell and Mack avenues and Sylvester street, where not already built.

Part 1 is due and payable within 30 days from date of this notice. Parts 2, 3 and 4 become due and payable in one, two and three years respectively from the date of this notice, together with interest at the rate of 7 per cent from the date of the confirmation of the roll.

Either of said parts may be paid within 30 days from date of this notice without interest.

If either of said parts one, two, three or four shall not be paid when they become due, 5 per cent penalty and interest at the rate of 7 per cent from date of confirmation of the assessment roll will be added, and the premises assessed will be advertised and sold as provided by law.

Detroit, Tuesday, Jan. 3, 1905.

The Council was called to order by the President, Hon. William F. Moeller.

### Third Reading of Ordinance.
