

**Ordinances.**

AN ORDINANCE changing the name

of the street and highway known as Adel street to Helen avenue.

Section 1 That the name of the 2 street and highway known as Adel 3 street, extending from Harper avenue to Strong avenue, shall hereafter be known and designated as 6 Helen avenue.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take immediate effect.
