

Minority Report.

To the Honorable the Common Council:

Gentlemen—Your Committee on Ordinances, to whom was referred the petition of E. N. Williams, et al., for changing the name of Beech street to Adams avenue west, beg leave to report that we have had this matter under consideration, and find that a majority of the property owners on Beech street desire the name of said street changed to Adams avenue west. They contend that the street is properly on a line with Adams avenue west, except for a slight jog at Grand River avenue. Your committee, as well as the aldermen from the Fourth and Sixth wards, are unanimous for changing the name of said street, and so being, we recommend the passage of the following ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE changing the name of Beech street to Adams avenue west.

It is hereby ordained by the people of the City of Detroit.

Section 1. That the name of the 2 street and highway in the City of 3 Detroit heretofore known as Beech 4 street, shall be and the same is 5 hereby changed and shall hereafter 6 be known as Adams avenue west.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take 2 immediate effect.

THIRD WARD.

Ordinance.

Ald Gutman presented the following:

AN ORDINANCE to amend Section 14 of Chapter 56 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1904.

It is hereby ordained by the people of the City of Detroit:

Section 1. That Section 14 of Chapter 56 of the Compiled Ordinances of the City of Detroit for the year 1904 be and the same is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

Sec. 14. The use of any part of 2 the sidewalks or sidewalk spaces or 3 spaces within the lines of any street 4 or avenue for areas, steps, porches, 5 portieres, railings or any other pro- 6 jections is prohibited, except that 7 bay or oriel windows may, with 8 consent of the Common Council, 9 be constructed not less than twelve 10 feet from the sidewalk grade, 11 which shall extend not to exceed 12 three feet over the street line or 13 have a frontage to exceed fifteen 14 feet, nor shall there be more than 15 one bay or oriel window for any 16 fifteen feet of frontage, and no two 17 such windows shall be built nearer 18 to each other than five feet.

Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take 2 immediate effect.

Read twice by title, ordered printed and referred to the Committee on Ordinances.
